The first hurdle was to understand the travel requirements vis-a-vis COVID. The Stem Cell Institute made it a small hurdle, and so did Rob as he was footing the bill! You see, he was going for medical reasons and I was going as his companion, a requirement of the Institute.

A last hurdle was presented three days before departure and it was called the OMICRON variant. In order to return to the United States, we would be required to have a negative COVID test. Again the Institute helped big time to manage that hurdle when the time came.



On the last day of the trip we were guided by **Roberto** to the Miraflores locks which is one of the three locks of the Panama Canal and the name of the small lake that separates these locks from the Pedro Miguel Locks upstream. In the Miraflores locks, vessels are lifted (or lowered) 54 feet (16.5 m) in two stages, allowing them to transit to or from the Pacific Ocean port of Balboa in Panama City. Ships cross below the Bridge of the Americas, which connects North and South America. From the visitors center we saw ships travel from the Atlantic ocean to the Pacific.
